At the conclusion, our pastor Dr. Stephen Hokuf, will be giving the closing remarks


I encourage you to seriously consider being a part of this wonderful evening of intercession for our beloved country that is in dire need of revival. **SEE YOU THERE!**

forth a little shoot with a branch
that not only lives, but it bears
fruit and fills the whole earth.

This is a Messianic prophecy. Jesus the Messiah is the branch. At first he comes as a humble son of a carpenter from Galilee. The royal line of David hasn't had a king on the throne for hundreds of years. It looks like the "tree" and its stump are dead. However, it isn't completely dead. Out of the humble beginnings in Bethlehem, a young couple, both in the royal line of David, has a son, Jesus. Jesus is also the root of Jesse. He is the Almighty God, the creator of us all. Think about it. He is both the root and the branch! What a prophecy.

Isaiah himself probably didn't realize the full meaning of these words. It was a mystery until the

incarnation. God became man and dwelt among us, who could have imagined that that was even possible?

The world is still waiting for the final fulfillment of these and hundreds of similar prophecies. Christians, for centuries, have been praying for His kingdom to come and His will to be done on earth as it is in heaven. It will be like the "spring time" of history; a time of light after many millennia of darkness. Even so, come Lord Jesus.

On Mother's Day, May 13th, you may pick up your baby bottle(s) to fill with loose change or enclose a check for the benefit of the pregnancy center. They will need to be returned by Father's Day, June 17th.

This year, in addition to the baby bottles, we would like to do something special for Cecil County Pregnancy Center. We would like to have a baby shower for them on Mother's Day. Cecil County Pregnancy Center has a special baby boutique where mothers can earn new items for their babies. In order to obtain something from the boutique, they have to earn points. After they have earned so many points, then they can pick out a needed item.

Below is a list of items needed by the boutique. Large boxes, wrapped in baby shower themed wrapping paper, will be available at the back of the sanctuary and in the hallway of the educational wing. 
